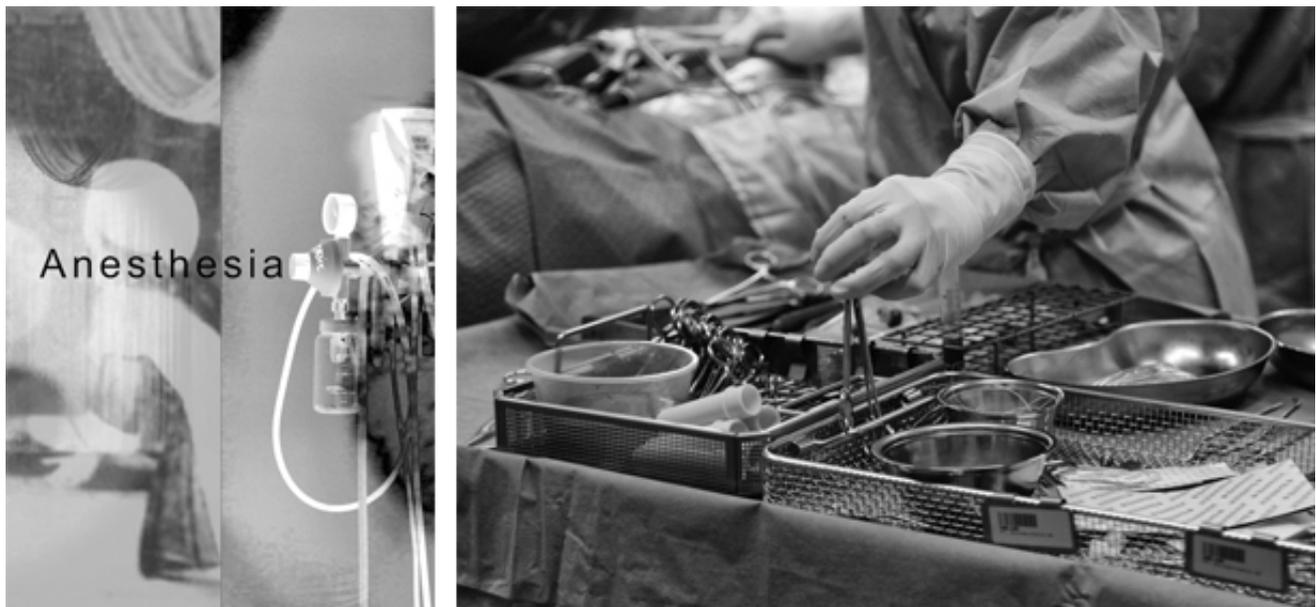


## 51. | The Blinding Light

La Lumière aveuglante est une vidéo en noir et blanc de 11 minutes et 57 secondes faite de plusieurs images superposées. La toile de fond est un tableau de Fra Angelico intitulé La guérison du diacre Justinien sur lequel a été fusionné plusieurs photographies et vidéos prises dans un bloc opératoire.

L'œuvre de Fra Angelico est une des scènes de la prédelle du retable de Saint Marc datant de 1440. Cette tempera sur bois est exposée au musée nationale San Marco à Florence. L'œuvre retrace différents miracles de deux saints, Côme et Damien. Dans cette scène, les frères d'origine arabes réalisent un miracle posthume par la greffe de la jambe d'un maure éthiopien qui venait d'être enseveli au cimetière de Saint- Pierre au diacre. L'épisode évoque le métissage d'un corps blanc et d'un membre noir, celle d'un vivant et d'un mort en interrogeant finalement la notion de race et l'hybridation de l'identité. Sur les clichés contemporains de bloc opératoire où apparaît la technologie et l'hygiénisme, les médecins côtoient les deux saints formant un seul groupe de travail. Ainsi, les fantômes et les vivants présents dans une autre forme de réalité, une temporalité fantasmée sont tout aussi miraculeux que le texte religieux.

Surenchérisant sur cette idée d'hybridation, dans cette vidéo mounir fatmi opère un jeu habile en mariant la renaissance à l'hypermodernité. Cette ellipse temporelle, superposant les espaces temps, fait apparaître la technologie, l'anesthésie dans un monde fait auparavant de miracles divins. Les personnages du tableau deviennent alors des fantômes. Ce décalage contraint le spectateur à opérer un aller-retour mental entre les deux époques. Ainsi, la superposition des époques met en avant l'idée qu'un miracle religieux est désormais tout à fait réalisable de nos jours.

Blinding Light is a black-and-white, 11 minutes and 57 seconds long video made of several superimposed images. The backdrop is a painting by Fra Angelico entitled, The Healing of the Deacon Justinian, onto which several photographs and videos from a contemporary surgical unit were merged.

This tempera on wood painting by Fra Angelico is from one of the scenes on the predella of the altarpiece of Saint Mark dating from 1440 and located in the National Museum San Marco in Florence. The work traces different miracles of two saints, Como and Damian. In this scene, the brothers of Arab origin realize a posthumous miracle with the graft of the leg of an Ethiopian Moor who had just been buried in the cemetery of St. Peter of the deacon. Overarching this idea of ??hybridization, in this video mounir fatmi operates a skillful game by marrying the Renaissance to hypermodernity. This temporal ellipse, superimposing the two space-times, renders the technology and the anesthesia divine, much as a miracle was held as divine. The characters in the picture then become ghosts. This gap forces the viewer to operate a mental back and forth between the two eras. Thus, the superimposition of the times emphasizes the idea that a religious miracle is nowadays entirely feasible.

mounir fatmi tente ainsi de croiser de manière inattendue deux sphères de croyances bien souvent vues comme antagonistes. D'une part, celle de la science, de l'ordre, de la raison et du concret ; et d'autre part, celle de la religion où il est question de foi, de miracle et du sacré.

mounir fatmi thus tries to cross unexpectedly two spheres of beliefs often seen as antagonists. On the one hand, that of science, order, and reason; And on the other hand, that of religion, with its reliance on faith, miracle and the sacred.

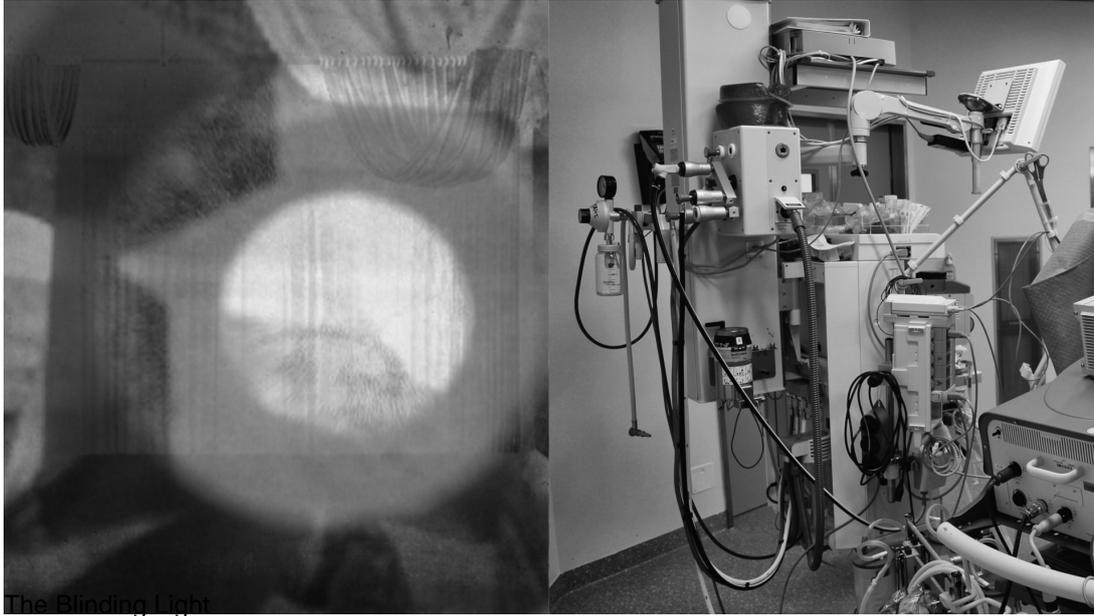
