Les affaires des sphères est une installation associant des photomontages, des poèmes imprimés et encadrés et une pièce sonore. Les photomontages sont réalisés à partir de photographies extraites du film *Casablanca*, auxquelles ont été appliqués des figures géométriques. Elles mettent en scène les amants de face, lorsqu'ils s'approchent l'un de l'autre pour s'embrasser, puis le mari et la femme, observés par un troisième personnage, l'amant platonique. Les poèmes sélectionnés sont tirés de l'œuvre de Soddy (prix Nobel de chimie et mathématicien) intitulée "Le baiser précis" qui s'inspire des cercles tangents de Descartes. La pièce sonore, quant à elle, est à écouter au casque audio et mêle une voix robotique récitant un poème à une voix humaine prononçant et répétant certaines phrases comme des mantras.

L'installation aborde la question du désir défini comme tendance vers un objet connu ou imaginé. Elle constitue une double tentative de modélisation et d'expérimentation des mécanismes (manifestes ou éventuellement inconscients) et des effets du désir. Elle s'inscrit enfin dans la recherche d'une esthétique propre à rendre compte d'un phénomène difficile à décrire et qui se trouve pourtant au cœur des relations amoureuses, du processus créatif et de toute action humaine en général.

L'installation multiplie les points de vue et les approches : plastiques et poétiques, abstraites et figuratives, biographique et universelle. La série photographique *Casablanca circles* fait en effet le lien entre la biographie de l'artiste et son enfance à Casablanca d'un côté et de l'autre l'imaginaire et l'univers fictionnel où agissent désirs et sources d'inspiration. Pratique et théorique enfin : le titre semble poser la question de savoir ce qu'il advient quand le

Spherical Affairs is an installation combining photomontages, printed and framed poems and a sound creation. The photomontages are made from stills from the movie *Casablanca*, on which geometric figures were applied. They show the lovers face to face as they move closer to each other to kiss, then the husband and wife observed by a third character, the platonic lover. The selected poems are taken from a book by Soddy, a chemistry Nobel Prize winner and mathematician, entitled "The Kiss Precise", which was inspired by Descartes' tangent circles. As for the sound piece, designed to be listened to with headphones, it combines a robotic voice reciting a poem with a human voice repeating certain sentences like mantras.

The installation focuses on the question of desire as an attraction towards a known or imagined object. It constitutes a double attempt for the modeling and experimentation of the mechanisms (whether manifest or possibly unconscious) and effects of desire. It is also part of the search for an aesthetic that could transcribe a phenomenon that is difficult to describe although it's at the heart of romantic relationships, of the creative process and generally of any human endeavor.

The installation creates multiple points of view and approaches: plastic and poetic, abstract and figurative, biographic and universal. The series of photographs *Casablanca Circles* creates a connection between the artist's biography on one hand, as he spent his childhood in Casablanca, and the fictional universe where desire and sources of inspiration are at play, on the other hand. Finally, it combines practice and theory: the title seems to ask what happens when the circle becomes a sphere – when it becomes incarnate, so to speak.

L'œuvre établit une esthétique de la diversité et de la profusion. Elle multiplie les figures géométriques, les éléments plastiques et graphiques, les voix, les protagonistes engagés dans le commerce amoureux : elle aborde la complexe géométrie du "trouple" (forme de couple augmentée) ou des amours triangulaires. Elle rend ainsi compte par une série de séductions et d'étourdissements de la nature profondément vertigineuse du désir.

Elle met surtout en scène le corps. L'association d'une voix robotique et à une voix humaine met en relation le discours sur la structure et le discours sur le corps. Elle tient unis le charnel et l'abstraction, la sensualité et la géométrie. La voix humaine qui se fait entendre comme un appel, un avertissement - et bien qu'elle soit difficilement audible, constitue le surgissement discret et pourtant obsédant du corps comme élément essentiel dans l'économie du désir. Elle se caractérise également comme une mise à l'épreuve du spectateur par le réel dans ce qu'il a de plus intime.

L'installation participe finalement à la fondation d'une esthétique du baiser, entendu comme figure de la rencontre, des correspondances artistiques, du dialogue des arts et de la science, de la double approche théorique et pratique, de l'association de la sensualité et de la rigueur formelle.

It binds together carnality and abstraction, sensuality and geometry. The human voice can be heard as a call, a warning – and though it's hardly audible, it represents the discreet yet haunting emergence of the body as the essential element in the economy of desire. It also establishes itself as a confrontation of the viewer with reality in its most intimate aspects.

Finally, the installation also participates in the foundation of an esthetic of the kiss, seen as a representation of encounters, artistic correspondences, the dialogue between arts and science, theoretical and practical approaches, the association of sensuality and formal precision.

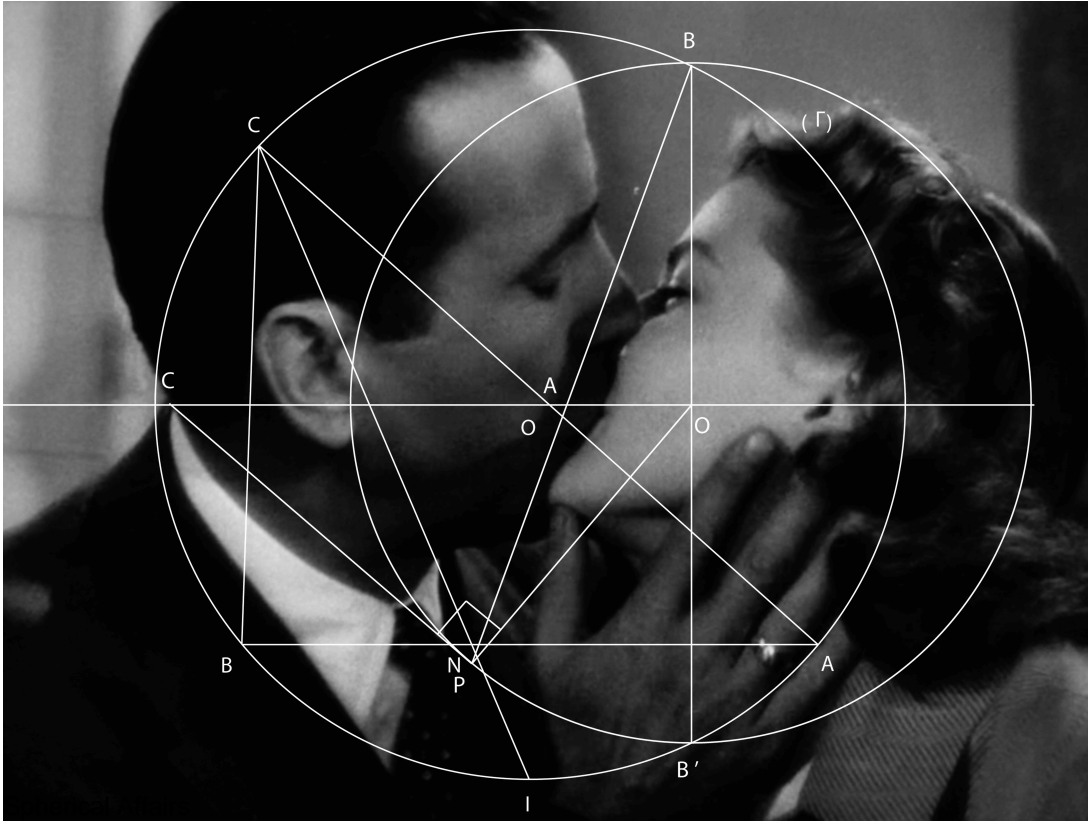
